Notice of the adoption of the Allerdale Local Plan (part 1)

Notice is hereby given that Allerdale Borough Council adopted the Allerdale Local Plan (Part 1) on 16 July 2014.

The Allerdale Local Plan (Part 1) covers the area of Allerdale outside the Lake District National Park and sets out the strategic and development management policies that will guide development up to 2029. It also includes alterations to the Proposal Map. The policies that are replaced by Allerdale Local Plan (part 1) are listed in appendix 9 of the adopted Local Plan.

- The document is not within the appropriate power and/or
- A procedural requirement has not been complied with

Any application must be made promptly and in any event no later than 6 weeks after the date on which the Allerdale Local Plan (Part 1) was adopted.
